In 1916 his great uncle was killed in the battle of Fromelles and the family knew very little about the circumstances of his death, as he was one of 212 soldiers who were unaccounted for after the battle. Research revealed that many bodies had been recovered by the Germans and mass buried. A project was undertaken to exhume, identify and bury these soldiers. A headstone dedication service was held in Fromelles in July.
