The Tour included Copenhagen, Lisbon and London. They did a cycling tour in Copenhagen looking at the architecture etc.

Gary thanked Phil for his initiatives to further his business and his presentation.

YOUTH EXCHANGE


Our Exchange Student Jasper Holst of Germany is staying with the Miegel family.



ASSUMPTIONS

We tend to make assumptions about intentions and motivations from witnessing someone's behavior, yet our choices of making a correct assumption are average to poor.

First, behavior doesn't always mirror intentions. Secondly, we could be interpreting the behavior incorrectly.

Thirdly, we're making assumptions about the person's intentions and motivations based on what we know – which might not apply to the person in question.

While we all make assumptions based on behavior because it's the most obvious tool we have, it's important to realize that we might not always be right.

So be wary of launching into action or accusation as a result of your own assumptions.
