Youth Create and Celebrate, Graduation

On Sunday afternoon May 29th Rotarians Meredith Miegel, Neil Davis and Graham Brown represented Corowa Rotary Club at the graduation celebration of six young people who had been immersed in leadership opportunities for the local environment.

Given that 'the Environment' is Rotary International's 7th and newest Area of Focus and that our Club is committed to the Whitehead St Wetlands Project it was a pleasure to be there. The leadership program was/is a Corowa Landcare facilitated program and the afternoon event was chaired by Councillor Sally Hughes with special guest Justin Clancy MLA. Other community groups were represented too.

Each young person - mainly Corowa High Year 8 but recruited while in Year 6 Primary - gave an account of their involvement in the Whitehead Street Wetlands Project. This mainly concerned the planting of ground cover indigenous grasses and understory shrubs and the setting up of a reptile habitat.

The young people had met regularly with Sally over a 2-3 year period and Landcare had provided for them tutors on aspects of leadership and the environment in order to extend their knowledge and confidence.

Sally spoke to a slide show summary of the program which was illustrated by a student from Oaklands with her sketches of lizards, birds and native flora. A film crew had put together a video summary of the main features of the program over the last few years which included some encouraging remarks from Meredith. Justin Clancy MLA presented the certificates.
