

Rotary Information- Info supplied by Howard Scheetz From the front lines of polio eradication

Ann Lee Hussey is a member of the Rotary Club of Portland sunrise, in Maine, US, and contracted polio as a child, leaving her with permanent disabilities. But with each of the 30 international immunisation missions she has undertaken or led, Anne Lee is filled with personal satisfaction for the difference it makes. "Polio has a much different impact on those in the developing world, where lack of access to surgical interventions, physical therapy and mobility devices create a far more physically disabled individual, not to mention the mental health toll on individuals being hidden or shunned by the community members when they are in public," she said. Anne Lee has seen resistance to the vaccine decrease over the years, with her team often welcomed by families they visit. Repeat visitation to a community where people recognise her and her team have proven beneficial in establishing higher vaccination rates, as has hiring local elder women, and educating mothers. But international immunisation missions are not easy tasks. Working in temperatures over 37 degrees Celsius in extreme dry and dusty conditions; walking through fields with poisonous snakes; venturing down dirt roads far from the town on the city streets with the open sewage; and wandering through busy open-air markets in search of children are just some of the examples of the conditions Ann Lee in her teams have worked in to vaccinate children against polio. As well as higher vaccination rates. Anne Lee has also seen a marked improvement in the delivery of the vaccine over the past 20 years. 'Health workers today are better educated on the cold chain and keeping your vaccines potent, and now compensated in a timely fashion, with much greater appreciation for their daily efforts." Anne Lee is immensely proud of her contribution to eradicating polio, with India certified polio free in 2014 and the African continent certified polio free in August 2020 both are regions Anne Lee has visited multiple times. "So many worked for so long to make this happen, and I am grateful to all. We have eradicated two of the three types of the wild polio virus we will succeed with eradicating the third."


