

International Toast: Queenstown Rotary has been chartered since April 1944. (I had to look that up!) We currently have 52 members, having increased our membership over the past couple of years thanks to a concerted effort to attract new members. Queenstown is primarily a resort town and with lake and mountains, it is known as the "adventure capital of New Zealand" being the home of bungy jumping, skiing, rafting, biking etc. etc. As a consequence of that Covid has had a marked effect on the town with many businesses struggling. As we have had relative freedom within New Zealand and no ability to travel overseas the domestic tourism has compensated for this to some extent.

As we have a small town called Glenorchy 45 km from here at the head of the lake, we have been approached and are entering into a sister club formal relationship with the Glenorchy club of Tasmania.

We meet weekly for a dinner meeting at a local hotel but once a month we have started an offsite meeting at various venues around town, and this has been a very popular move with the members.

As a club we have raised money for covid relief in our area over the past year. Our current President has an environmental agenda so we are working with local groups clearing unwanted plants from hillsides etc. Our membership director is also organising a weekend away for March next year to another town, approx. 3hours drive from here tying in environmental talks, interclub meetings, meals and activities such as boat trips, walks etc.

Note: their club president is Jason Climo and they meet at 5.30 on Tuesdays at the Holiday Inn.

- 1. My Rotary information is Rotary information itself.
- 2. Some years ago, Corowa Rotary Club introduced the International Toast and Rotary information to be part of each weekly meeting. This is where each Rotarian was rostered to investigate an international Toast and a piece of Rotary information
- 3. At the time we had quite a few new members. At the time the board found that some members, not just the new member were struggling to keep up with changes to the Rotary organization.
- 4. So, Rotary information was introduced to lift the knowledge of the new members as well as some of the older members. To try to bring all members up to speed with changes in Rotary.

So, a challenge was given to all our members to investigate some part of Rotary. Maybe something they did not understand or were not sure about. If they are not sure about some part of Rotary, it stands to reason that there could be other members who would be in a similar position.

5. At this present time, it is quite noticeable that the enthusiasm for Rotary Information and the international Toast has waned quite a bit.

6. For me this was particularly noticeable when I was putting together last week's international toast. To find out additional information for the toast I had to contact the club I was proposing to toast.

Namely the Noon Rotary Club of Grand Island Nebraska, USA.

- 7. The reaction I received surprised me. So I will just read what was sent back to me ---
- 8. Hello Neil, what a very cool request! I can tell you our club president is Brad Mellema. I'm going to be heading into my office within about an hour and a half, and I will do some work to gather up that information! My name is LeAnne and I have been a rotary member since 2018, so fairly new to the organization! I do the posting to our Facebook page And I'm currently president elect. I'm learning a lot more about rotary every day!
- 9. That is an amazing way to branch out and understand the scope of this organization globally! That is something we are working on in our chapter, we all have a strong sense of our own community and the need for service right here, I think there is always so much to learn from exploring outside our area, so much to be inspired by when you look at other chapters across the globe!
- 10. As I mentioned Brad Mellema is our current President. Each week we meet and have a local speaker come in and share a topic with us. It's a great way we have been able to stay engaged in our community and make some new connections! Brad is a wonderful resource for our Rotary chapter, he is the head of the local convention and visitor's bureau, so as you can imagine, he has a wealth of knowledge and connections in our community!
- 11. I really love the connection you have to Rotary in relation to your daughter's experience! Grand Island has two Rotary chapters. Our group is the larger one, we typically meet at noon. There is a smaller group that typically meets early in the morning, called the Sunrise club. There is a gentleman in that club that is very involved in the youth activities, and I am just becoming more familiar with him now that we are getting out a bit more from the pandemic. I have a lot to learn about those programs and I plan to get to know him better so I can learn more about that! I believe that gentleman is an upcoming district officer.
- 12. At this point she goes on to give me more information about her club, which I read out last week.
- 13. I would bet that when she is President that she will be introducing an international toast and Rotary information.


