Guest Speaker- Matt Flaherty from Wodonga Central



In 1989 Matt went on his first trek to Nepal for a 5 week stint, no guest houses involved it was a great experience. Matt has now been back several times to work in the Nepal Eye Project. In developing countries, 4 out of five people who are blind don't need to be. Eye diseases like cataract, trachoma and diabetic retinopathy can lead to blindness when, in fact they're either treatable or preventable. The reason people live with blindness is that they can't access quality eye health care. In many cases, a straight forward 20 – minute operation can restore sight or a dose or antibiotics can prevent blindness.

Cataracts- a cataract is a clouding of the lens of the eye. It is the leading cause of blindness around the world, except for developed countries.

Uncorrected Refractive Error- Refractive error occurs when the eye cannot clearly focus on images , resulting in blurred vision 1. Globally, uncorrected refractive errors (URE) are the main cause of visual impairment 2. This problem is corrected with simple eye examination and a pair of prescription glasses.

Trachoma- This is a bacterial infection and a leading cause of blindness where there is a shortage of water and crowded living conditions. It is easily spread through eye discharge from infected people on their hands and clothing, and also through direct transmission by flies. This is treated with antibiotics, face washing and education. Surgery is needed if it has been left too long to be treated. **Diabetic Retinopathy** – This is a significant cause of blindness worldwide. If left untreated it will cause vision loss that is irreversible. Blood sugar levels from diabetes eventually damage the blood vessels in the retina.

Glaucoma- is an eye disease caused by increased pressure within the eye. It can develop at any age. Although glaucoma can be treated and sight often maintained (if diagnosed in time). Operation eyesight works with local medical professionals in developing countries to support comprehensive eye care that includes diagnosis and surgical treatment of the glaucoma. By constructing facilities, providing equipment and supporting medical personnel at existing facilities, operational Eyesight helps prevent and treat Glaucoma.
