



If restrictions ease were possible please invite a fellow Rotarian to join you who might not already zoom as this week will definitely be a zoom meeting regardless of restrictions.


Keep an eye out on raising floodwaters in the event that we may need to move contents out of our shipping container if the waters are over the 5 meter level.
