Rotary Information - Neil Davis Australian Rotary Health (ARH)

Australian Rotary Health is one of the largest independent funders of mental health research within Australia.

Australian Rotary Health was founded by Ian Scott. Ian was a banker. In 1981, while he was a member of the Rotary Club of Mornington, he was move by the plight of families affected by sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS).

Australian Rotary Health (ARH) has moved on from research into SIDS to being a project of the Rotary Districts of Australia and the Rotary Clubs in those Districts. Australian Rotary Health (ARH) has a broad vision to improve the health and wellbeing of all Australians. It provides funding into a broad range of general health areas; provide scholarships for rural medical and nursing students, as well as Indigenous health students. Australian Rotary Health (ARH) provides funding into areas of health that do not readily attract funding, and promotes those findings to the community. Australian Rotary Health (ARH) provides funding into four focus areas.

1. Mental Health Research

Since the year 2000, Australian Rotary Health has focused its funding on mental health research. In 2012 this focus narrowed to the Mental Health of Young Australians, and in 2013 research projects focusing on the Prevention of Mental Health Disorders were included.

There are three ways they fund mental health Research.

- 1) Mental Health Research Grants
- 2) Ian Scott Scholarships
- 3) Postdoctoral Fellowships

We come into contact with Mental Health Research by taking part in the "Lift the Lid" program. This is a mental health fundraiser. There is a hat day occurring on the 10th October this year to support "Lift the Lid" which we can support.

2. General Health Research

Australian Rotary Health engages with a variety of funding partners to provide Research Grants and PhD Scholarships. These projects encompass a broad range of general health areas including cancer, heart disease, children's health, motor neuron disease, diabetes and more.

There are two ways they fund general health research.

- 1) Funding Partner PhD Scholarships.
- 2) Research Companion PhD Scholarships

3. Indigenous Health Scholarships

These Scholarships support Indigenous students to undertake tertiary training in nursing physiotherapy, psychology, dentistry and other health related degrees at university. These scholarships help Indigenous students to overcome barriers to tertiary study and qualification. The Rotary district 9790 "Ride to Conference", which some of the members of the Corowa Rotary club take part in each year supports Australian Rotary health (ARH) and is also currently sponsoring an Indigenous medical student in Darwin through ARH. It is worth noting that the district 9790 "Ride to Conference" was the brain child Graham Brown with the support of his wife Margaret.

4. Rural Medical & Nursing Scholarships

Australian Rotary Health (ARH) provides scholarships for medical and nursing students to undertake placements at a rural and remote health care service. Students experience what these facilities have to offer and provide an incentive for recipients to pursue a career in rural Australia upon graduation


