Founded in 1911, we are the oldest Rotary club in Colorado, with a rich history of serving the Denver Metro community. We also are the 31st Rotary Club to be established; hence, the name Club 31. The Rotary Club of Denver is part of a regional and international network of clubs all devoted to connecting community leaders in shared service.

Rotary information Corowa Rotary Club charter at last week's changeover president Norm, in paraphrasing the induction charge made reference to the account accourrements of office which he duly presented to incoming president Deb, There was a gavel which is a symbol of the President's authority, the manual of procedure for Rotary leaders which is a 130 page book or reality today a USB stick. There's the president's lapel pin and name badge also the collar of office all of which recognises leadership. But there is also the Corowa Rotary Club Charter framed and protected by glass. The text of the induction charge reads "I present to you for safekeeping the charter of this Rotary Club". The charter is the symbol of the statues of your club as an autonomous club within district 9790 and the association of Rotary International I charge you to maintain the privileges bestowed upon us by this charter and to hand it proudly to your properly elected successor in 12 months' time. It would be interesting sometime to unlock some of the text of the induction charge what does it mean that our club is autonomous? Also what are the privileges of being a chartered club? Rotary clubs have charter evenings to celebrate important birthdays. Yarrawonga Mulwala have invited us to celebrate their 75th as we their sponsor club. As we know we have been charted by the Rotary Club of Albury on the 17th of May 1939. Since then, according to our archives, we've celebrated charter evenings for our 50th in 1989 with an anniversary port and tree planting with special guest Shire president Bill Bott, our 60th in 1999 when we received a certificate from district governor Neville Miles, our 68th in 2008 when we had a special programme evening reminiscence by past presidents archivist Graham Campbell presented for perusal folders prepared by Jan Darby that time, our 75th in 2014 we were awarded a special certificate by Rotary International president Ron Burton Greg Kaplan MLA and DG Phil Clancy were our guests that night and our 80th and most recent in 2019 where president bill bought and Hi longer serving member Neil Davis shared in the slicing of the enormous cake.


