 Rotary's Seventh Area of Focus (Graham B) - The Rotary Trustees and Rotary International Board of Directors has added SUPPORT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT as our seventh Area of Focus. More than \$18 US million in Foundation global grant funding has been allocated to environment related projects over the last five years.

One such international environmental project under the leadership of Past RI President Shekhar Mehtar and involving ten or more countries is mangrove restoration.

Mangroves (ref RDU August 2022) are essential in providing coastline protection, food security and the livelihood for millions. Mangroves excel at capturing harmful CO2 emissions from the atmosphere making them crucial in the battle against climate change.

The article in this month's RDU outlines what Rotary Clubs in the Western Port area are doing in cooperation with Government bodies to restore the ecosystem in the Bay. Called the Western Port Seagrass Partnership (WPSP) Melbourne Water has installed sedimentation traps while Rotarians have been donning gum boots and wet weather gear and planting mangroves and sea grass.

- Rotary Market Volunteers (Bill B) Bill praised those Rotary members
 who stepped up to do the market on Sunday given that a number of regular
 volunteers were away. It demonstrated that the club membership was
 committed to meeting their community activities.
- Andrej Arrival (Deb) Andrej is adjusting quite well, still a bit of jet lag, but getting there.

Savernake Rainfall Figures - David Sloane

David's family has been farming at Savernake for generations. They have been recording rainfall in the region since 1867 and as a result have made the following findings:

- There has been an 8% drop in annual rainfall
- Rainfall patterns have changed leading to climate change
- This climate change has forced farmers to adapt by changing their farming processes
- This in turn has affected wildlife, specifically birdlife, with some species numbers reduced or disappearing altogether

David emphasized that climate change is the major issue of our time and we need to recognize and act before it is too late.



But What Can I Do - Sally Hughes

The Council recognizes climate change, is creating a Climate Adaptation Plan and is seeking input from:

- General rate payers
- Farmers
- Children

The council is also looking to identify areas of concern as a result of climate change and its associated risks and preparing action plans.
