Sergeant's Help Rosemary F District Governor David McPherson was introduced to the meeting by President Stephen Apps and warmly welcomed by all members.

David began by identifying his intention to visit 65 clubs within his region between July and November.

Outlined the 2022 – 2023 theme "You don't imagine yesterday. You imagine tomorrow."

David explained the theme logo:

- Designed by indigenous artist Riki Salam.
- Circle signifies our connections to one another.
- The 7 dots represent people and the Rotary Foundation's 7 areas of focus.
- Together = a navigation star our guiding light.
- The solid line underneath is a digging stick. A tool for getting things done. Rotarians are people of action.

Rotary International President Jennifer E Jones interpretation of the colours:

- Purple stands for polio eradication. Joining with the World Health. Organization (WHO) to fight polio with vaccinations. Pointed out that in 1985 there were 1000 polio cases a day. Now there are approximately 8 cases per year.
- Green for the environment (7th area of focus).
- White for peace. Rotary's core mission.

Jennifer E Jones on RI goals:

- Serve our members to serve our communities.
- Empowering girls and women in Rotary. RI Board target of 30% women in Rotary by 30th June 2023.
- Raise Rotary's profile in our region.
- Develop new clubs including new club models.

Comfort and Care of Rotary Family

- Create the most welcoming experience for every Rotary member
- Align the activities in your club to the passions of your members engage their hands and hearts.
- Give members the opportunity to discover an "aha moment" where they feel fully engaged in Rotary.

Rotary International on Diversity

- Mirror the diversity in your community within your club
- RI has defined diversity as "welcoming and including people of all backgrounds, experiences and identities regardless of their age, ethnicity, race, colour abilities, religion, socioeconomic status, culture, sex, sexual orientation, or gender identity."

- Community diversity reflected in your club brings to the club a greater range of thoughts, ideas and beliefs.

- Three of the four priorities of the RI action plan have been achieved:
 - Increase your impact
 - o Expand your reach
 - o Enhance participant engagement

My "I" (inclusion) Story

- My mother was not going to send me to a special school. Instead she had the local primary school install ramps to include me with the local school population.
- Secondary school was the same process, so I and other disabled students could be included with other local students, ramps were installed.
- Joining Rotary was an inclusive process where I was welcomed into the club and organization as an equal member.

- Include all members in the decision making within the club.
- Ensure equality where every member has the opportunity to achieve their passion for being a Rotarian.
- Include people from diverse groups so that they can integrate into your club, into your community and into your hearts.

This remarkable volunteer organisation, comprised of local retiree volunteers, and an initiative of the **Rotary Club of Scarborough Inc WA**, produces and distributes over 300 wheelchairs per month to disabled children in the developing world. Wheelchairs for Kids has been in operation since 1998 and over that period has provided over **52,000** wheelchairs assembled by over **280** volunteers who attend the Perth workshop; rostered on a weekly basis.

Every \$250 donated covers the material cost of one wheelchair.

Lily & Liam have chosen Wheelchairs For Kids as their Project during my year as District Governor for D9790.
