"The Rotary Club of Devonport, Tasmania has been launching brightly coloured teddy bears from a helicopter for 19 years as part of its Teddy Bear Fly in and Kite Festival. Three to four hundred bears are taken up to a suitable height in net and released with parachutes and the one landing closest to aiming marker wins. There are two classes of bears, the corporate bears have a \$100 jumping fee and the winning bear has a tax deductible \$4,000 donated in their name to Australian Rotary Health for research into gastroparesis. The children's bears are \$25 and winning owner receives an enormous bear with a sash and another exciting prize. This event has become the club's major fundraiser with \$80.000 going to Australian Rotary Heath."
