Rotary Information – Some notes from the ShelterBox / Rotary Partner Impact Report 2021 For much of the last ten years our Club has been able to donate a ShelterBox @ \$1000 annually to help displaced families across the world.

It has been calculated that every minute some 25 people somewhere are forcefully displaced by violence caused by conflict and crisis situations.

Some current statistics:

104 million people are displaced worldwide.

The number of people displaced is higher than at any other time in history.

The majority struggle to meet basic needs for food, water, and shelter.

Shelter is a fundamental human right.

Good quality shelter is a crucial step of recovery and reconstruction after a disaster.

Shelter helps keep families, as well as communities, together when they need each other most.
