### Girl Guides - Maree Higgins, her daughter Isabella & Sonya True:

Maree described her involvement with the girl guide program and how she started as a way of involving her daughter.

She is currently working towards being a Guide Leader and loves being involved in the guides movement

Bella outlined what she does as a girl guide and her excitement for her upcoming trip to Ballarat to attend the Girl Guide Jamboree. Corowa Rotary is providing \$500 towards helping the local girl guides who are attending the jamboree.

Sonya is the Guide Leader and went through some key Girl Guide items including:

- Mission statement is to empower girls and young women to grow into confident, self-respecting members of the community
- The Girl Guide movement is in 152 countries
- There are approximately 10 million girl guides around the world
- Girl Guides have been in Corowa for 95 years
- Girl Guides learn by doing
- The Guide Program is a non-formal education program based on shared leadership and decision making at all ages. It is organized around four elements:
  - Physical
  - o People
  - o Practical
  - o Self
- The seven fundamentals of the Australian Guide Program are:
   Promise & Law/Outdoors/Service/World Guiding/Guiding traditions/Leadership
   Development/Patrol System



#### International Toast - Paul M: Rotary Club of Volcano, Hawaii

In early May 2018, the Kilauea (kee.low.way.uh) volcano on the Big Island of Hawaii erupted, shooting lava 150 feet into the air. The lava pool in the volcano's crater dropped 1,500 feet as it flowed out cracks that formed along Kilauea's sides, the molten rivers consuming entire neighbor hoods and creating new land forms as they reached the ocean. Earthquake after earthquake rattled the area – an estimated 60,000 over 3 months, as the crater collapsed inward and quadrupled in size. Plumes of ash billowed and Hawaii Volcano National Park was shut down.

Members of the Rotary Club of Volcano lived through all of this. Their club met a five - minute hike from the craters edge.

The community of Volcano is situated within a lush rainforest at 1200 metres in elevation, 50km of winding road up from the coastal town of Hilo. The Volcano Club was chartered in2001 and most of it14 members are retired veterans. The eastern part of the island od Hawaii is the State's poorest region, and Volcano Rotarians are very focused on community service. They do a highway clean up once a month, they read to school kids and assist with the Community Pantry food drop. They run a program that places American flags in people's yards six times a year and they have painted the firehouse – twice.

This July, several big boxes of medical supplies, children's clothing, books and toys collected by the Rotary Club of Volcano were sent to a municipal medical clinic in the Philippines. All the supplies in the boxes were donated by people in Volcano and nearby areas and packed by Rotary Club members.

As a small club in a small town, the Volcano Rotarians don't hold traditional weekly meetings. Instead they clean the highway one Thursday morning each month, and hold a breakfast meeting at 8.00am on the first and third Thursdays at the Volcano Arts Centre.

#### Rotary Information - Ian K: The Rotary Wheel

The Rotary Wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since the earliest days. In 1923 the Rotary International Association adopted a mechanically correct gear wheel with 24 cogs and six spokes as the emblem. The number of cogs and spokes was intended to reflect a real working gearwheel. The number of spokes and cogs did not reflect any specific aspect of Rotary's history or programs and this remains true today.

In 1929 it was identified that the existing design made no provision for the transfer of power to or from the shaft, rendering the wheel idle. Given that Rotary is a "living force", inserting a keyway into the hub made the new wheel a real "worker".

The Rotary wheel remains our mark of excellence.
