This week's meeting was a Club Assembly lead by President Stephen.

Meals

- Various members indicated their dissatisfaction with the meals the proposed increase in price; value for money, lack of choice and (tonight) the 'entrée' size of the mains.
- Other members mentioned that we do have the advantage of a private room, table service and a lockable cupboard for our equipment.
- With the advent of the new chef, the meals have improved and the Royal is trying to cater to our requests.
- The question was raised regarding a possible alternate venue. The Royal is charging \$20, the RSL would be charging \$24 per head. We would then have to add on the usual \$5 to cover President's wine and raffles; money to pay for guest speaker and other Club funded guests (eg exchange student); and money to be donated to Foundation in each member's name (EREY)
- Another member made the comment that the question of the meals and cost is an issue with which we continually wrestle.
- President Stephen commented that the rise in meal costs will be absorbed by the Club this financial year but will definitely go up after Changeover. He will talk to the owners and work on some issues.
- Rotarians who do not tender their apology to Deb will definitely be invoiced for their meals.
- Prospective members still get their first meal free.
- A guest speaker has no charge for a meal, but any extra people accompanying the speaker should be paying for their own meal.

Graham announced that he had been in contact with each of the local schools to ascertain the enrolment numbers – as requested by the Board re the End of Year Bursaries. Bulletin

With Bill's absence for six months, Graham felt it was unfair that the publication of the Bulletin should fall to Deb and Stephen, both of whom have full time jobs and have other positions in the Club.

Mens Shed raffle

- Some members indicated their disappointment that the Mens Shed was refused permission to hold a raffle at our Federation Market. It was felt that we were seen not to be supportive of another community group which works to fill a need for others in the town.
- Some members wondered if the raffle on certain market days could be allocated to other group(s)
- It was pointed out that all proceeds of the raffles during the year go to putting on the Federation weekend. The raffles usually raise roughly \$5000 pa, which goes towards paying for the bands and the festival. As a Rotary Club we can put up a motion to pick two or three months a year to open the raffle to another organisation, but it diminishes our opportunity to raise money for the festival.

Federation Council and Service Groups

Following the recent meeting of the service clubs and Federation Council to enable a better working relationship, the hope was expressed that the Club would keep supporting this move to enable more festivals and events happening in the town. This meeting was attended by Rtns Bill B, Gary and Paul and, in another capacity as chair, Rtn Steve Kent.

Incoming President Bill was requesting a meeting on Sunday of various members re consulting on the assets register for the 2023-24 insurance survey documents.

Wetlands

- Following the flooding and the recent rains, the weed growth at the Wetlands has been prolific. The tracks are overgrown and there could be a possible fire hazard.
- Vandalism at the Wetlands specifically removal of boards from the boardwalk to the bird hide is disappointing to see.
- Members felt the need for slashing the weed growth and the vandalism should be raised with Coun-cil. Some thought we should set up a meeting with the Council to ask can we set up a roster to mow the paths at the wetland ourselves.

IGA Community Chest

Gary is to accept a cheque from the IGA Community Chest for \$1200 on Thursday 2-03-2023. He is going to mention to the organisers that this money will go towards our annual work at the Wetlands – ie be used in the community.

Corporate Membership

Despite the best efforts of the Board via letters and personal approaches, the collar bars remain missing. To replace the bars and frame a revamped collar would cost well in excess of \$1500
- There followed some discussion of the storage of such physical assets, including the original Hon-our Board, which was very badly water-damaged, and all the banners presented by other Clubs.
- On the suggestion of Rtn Howard, it was decided that the Club should move on. We do not need to replace the memorabilia at such significant cost to the Club. The names of the past Presidents are all recorded on the Club website along with other Club memorabilia and any member can have access to this facility as they wish.
