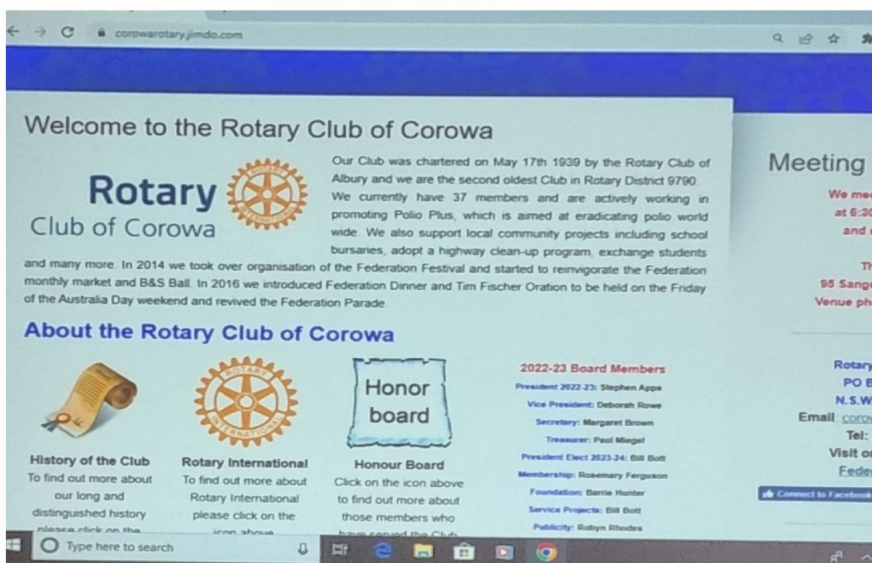
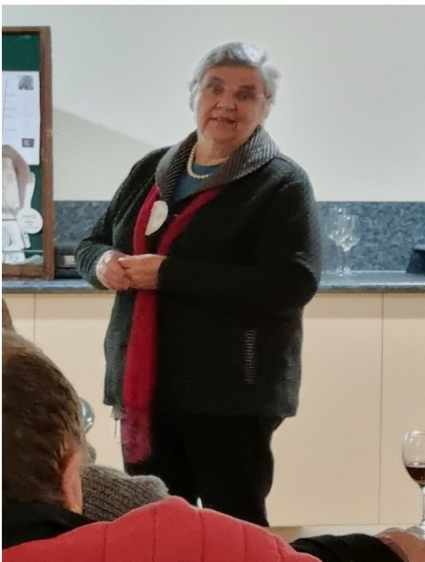

2. Meals – members felt there had been a lift in the presentation and variety of the meals we have enjoyed at the Royal.
3. AG Paul – mentioned that he is proud to be part of the RC of Corowa. He complimented the Club on the fellowship and friendship we enjoy with each other. The increase in our membership, he felt, was a direct result. Next year he will be District Chair for Membership, and members congratulated him on this appointment. Some of our newer members affirmed his remarks and mentioned their appreciation of being included in Rotary.
4. Working With Childrens Check – well done for all those who had recently validated their WWCC.

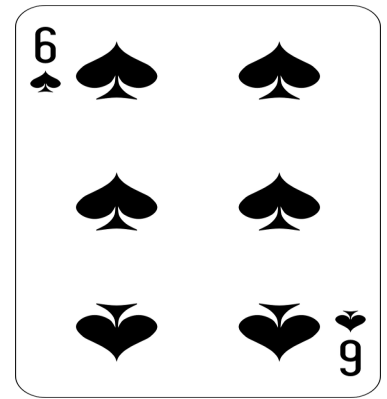
