





## Caitlin Reeves - Malawi

At this weeks meeting our guest Speaker was Corowa local, Caitlin Reeves. She spent 6 weeks in Malawi, the tiny African country above Zimbabwe, teaching children. Caitlin spoke about her amazing and fulfilling time teaching to around 80 children in a small village called, Mtakataka. She was teaching basic letters, words and numbers in a school of around 1000 students, who ranged from 8 to 13 years of age. All students at the school were given bowl of porridge each day as an initiative by the government to get more children to school. Caitlin taught outside, under a tree and the children sat on rocks and had one book each to do their work in. Caitlin also worked on a few medical clinics, where she went to other villages and treated children and adults for small wounds. Caitlin's parting gift to her students was a spoon each, something we take for granted but something that meant the world to the children at the school.
