This is the first Rotary Club in Thailand. An organisational meeting took place on 17th September 1930, and the club received its Charter on 28th November 1930. HRH Prince Purachatra Krom Phra Kampaeng Bejra was elected the Club's Charter President.

The Club currently has 92 members of 24 nationalities and the 2015-16 President is Ms Chiemi Svensson.
They have 4 sister Clubs – RC Kowloon-East (Hong Kong) RC Kuala Lumpur Diraja (Malaysia) RC Kyoto (Japan) and RC Hua Hin (Thailand).

Today 42 million people are displaced by armed conflict or persecution. Through our partnerships with several leading universities, Rotary Peace Fellows develop the skills to strengthen peace efforts, train local leaders to prevent and mediate conflict, and support long-term peace building in areas affected by conflict. We provide up to 100 peace fellowships per year at Rotary Peace Centres.



Peace profile: Maria Effendi



Maria is a former peace fellow now working as an assistant professor in peace and conflict studies at National Defense University (NDU) in Islamabad: "I teach courses on conflict analysis, applied conflict resolution, conflict transformation, and peace-building in the master's program. NDU is the pioneer institution that introduced peace studies and conflict resolution as a discipline to Pakistan's education system in 2008, and I joined the NDU team in early 2009 to further establish the department and curriculum




Exchange Student News.


