EAT IN OR TAKE AWAY

Not only are they providing this service for the public, but they are now focusing their services on caring for individuals whose diminished mobility makes it hard to shop for food and prepare meals – someone in their senior years, recovering from hospitalisation, a major illness or surgery. a person with a disability or someone needing assistance due to a special circumstance.



Meals are available at a low cost, from only \$7 a day. All meals are homemade and prepared in the café kitchen and delivered between 11:30am and 1:00pm, Monday through Friday. The meals can be eaten for lunch or dinner or frozen for a later date. There are also options available for weekends if required.

Sharon and Julie have built up relationships with their clients and look forward to seeing them each day. At times they could be the only people able to check on the safety of the clients and they also have the contact details in case of a fall or medical emergency.

That Lucky Alan was the winner of the Presidents Muscat again this week.



There's a few minutes of silence...


"I no like Jews either!" the copilot suddenly announces.
